Superintendent's Report

- ❖ Kathy Davis and Superintendent Denton presented several of our AP scholars with certificates of achievement, recognizing them for scoring a 3 or higher on at least 1 AP exam.
- ❖ School Resource Officer Scott Franklin provided information regarding safety training and security in our schools. After speaking with the creator of the ALICE program (Alert > Lockdown > Inform > Counter > Evacuate), he was pleased to be able to tell the BOE that our district is ahead of the game.
- ❖ Mr. Denton provided information regarding our per pupil funding and his continued concern for budget decreases in school funding.
- ❖ Mr. Denton announced our district's approval for certified classroom teachers to be able to "shop" at the Feed the Children Teacher Store in Oklahoma City for free classroom books.
- ❖ Mr. Denton announced the inception of our Bullying Tip Line, a website created in-house that students can use to report bullying incidents at school. This site runs at no cost to the district and will be maintained and monitored by administrators. As soon as a report is submitted, an alert will be sent to the administrators so they can address the issue. Flyers will be posted throughout schools, and a link will be set up on our website.
